



# **Executive Director's Message**







# High Times at Work? A Refresher for Employers on Marijuana Use by Employees



In 2016, California voters narrowly passed Proposition 64, which legalized the recreational use of marijuana. This law does not prevent private or public employers from having or enforcing workplace policies addressing the use or presence of drugs in an employee's system, such as marijuana. However, under federal law, marijuana use has remained illegal since 1970 under the Controlled Substances Act.

Just a few days into 2018, Attorney General Jeff Sessions issued a memorandum rescinding an Obama-era memorandum that took the position that the federal

government would not prosecute marijuana users in states in which the substance had been legalized. Sessions' memorandum prompts a quick refresher on the issue because it declares open season on recreational marijuana users for federal prosecutors, regardless of state law.

#### What Does Session's Recent Memorandum Mean for Employers?

Not too much. Sessions' memorandum simply makes clear that federal prosecutors can exercise their discretion when to prosecute marijuana users under federal law, despite state laws legalizing the substance. The renewed ability to do so will likely not lead to a significant increase in the number of marijuana related prosecutions. However, employers will do well to keep themselves up to date on this ever changing issue and consult with employment counsel for advice.

#### What Action Can Employers Take to Insulate Their Workplace from Legal Use of Marijuana?

Because marijuana is legal for recreational purposes in California, employers cannot prevent employees from using marijuana by saying such conduct is against state law. However, as briefly mentioned above, employers are not prevented from maintaining and enforcing zero tolerance policies against the manufacture, cultivation, distribution, possession or use of illegal drugs. The leeway granted by Proposition 64 allows employers to continue to maintain drug-free workplace policies. Thus, employers can also prohibit the use of marijuana by employees while on the employer's premises and while performing their work duties while away from the employer's premises. An employer's premises includes its parking lot and grounds.

Employers do not have to stop there. They may want to consider including language in their drug policies that prevent employees from coming to work with marijuana, or more precisely, THC, in their system. By framing the policy to prohibit marijuana from being in one's system, employers can avoid the uncertainty that arises when a policy simply prohibits being "under the influence of marijuana." Whether one is under the influence is subjective and difficult to determine. However, a drug test can objectively determine whether marijuana is in an employee's system.

#### How Can an Employer Determine if An Employee Has Marijuana in His or Her System?

Employers have the right to subject applicants and employees to drug testing. In California, employers can require applicants to submit to drug testing as a condition of employment. After this point, employers can lawfully require an employee to be drug tested if the employer has "reasonable suspicion" of drug use. Reasonable suspicion may arise based on a supervisor's observation, changes in an employee's behavior, or even after a work-related accident. Be careful. An accident only gives an employer reasonable suspicion if the accident could have been caused by drug use. Random testing is permitted for employees covered by the United States Department of Transportation's drug testing regulations.

#### Putting it All Together

Recreational use of marijuana is now legal in California. However, it remains illegal under federal law. The federal government has re-upped its hostile position toward recreational marijuana use.

California employers are free to maintain and enforce zero tolerance drug policies that prohibit even legal marijuana use. However, because marijuana remains in a person's system for a much longer period of time than alcohol, employers should take the time to consider to what extent marijuana use will be prohibited. Employers may want to consider their business needs, the preferences of consumers, the ability to find and retain talent, and any applicable state or federal law on the issue.


