# Flag on the Play?: Free Speech Concerns in the Private Workplace

Current political tides have heightened sensitivities to speech presenting viewpoints we do not necessarily agree with. Case and point, just look at the feud between President Trump and the NFL and between fans personally boycotting the NFL's slate of weekly football entertainment over disagreement over players kneeling during the National Anthem. This brief article provides employers with a simple and straightforward playbook for understanding what the law actually says about speech in the workplace and changes to expect moving forward.

#### First Amendment and the NLRA

The sense of entitlement that the First Amendment allows, or even entitles, employees to say whatever they like is widespread in the mainstream of consciousness. However, the First Amendment's protection of speech and expression does not extend to the private workplace. This is in contrast to the free speech protections long enjoyed by certain non-political public employees like police officers, firefighters, and teachers. However, employees in the private workplace do receive some protection from another source: the National Labor Relations Act (NLRA). Under that law, private employees in both unionized and non-unionized workplaces have the right to engage in "concerted activities" for their "mutual aid or protection." A simple example of this would be workplace campaigning to support a political candidate's promise to raise the minimum wage or increase the extent of job-protected leave for medical issues. The important feature is the direct connection between the speech and the "terms and conditions of employment" (where hourly pay and the extent of job-protected leave are terms and conditions of employment). This likely makes you feel uncertain as to what speech is protected in the workplace and what speech employers can put a stop to. The boundary between the two is often blurry. Employers will do well to know that the distinction exists so each instance encountered can be carefully handled after thoughtful consideration of what is best for the employer's business while adhering to existing legal confines.

#### Federal and California Law

The legal landscape does not end there. Employers must also be aware of federal antidiscrimination laws. These laws do not directly protect speech, but an employee's speech or activity can trigger these laws because speech or activity and the classes of people protected under these federal laws can easily overlap. Those protected classes are: race, color, sex, national origin, religion, age, disability, and genetic information. One can imagine a scenario in which an employer disciplines, suspends, or even terminates an employee for discussing religion in the workplace which bothers other employees. This action may open the employer up to a lawsuit for discriminating against that employee on the basis of his/her religion.

Finally, employers must stay on top of any restrictions placed upon them by the laws of their state. On Friday, October 20, 2017, a California State Senator issued a press release in which he vowed to introduce a bill in the 2018 legislative session to expand free speech protection to employees in the private workplace. The Senator expressly stated that his efforts were spurred on by the turbulent political scene regarding free speech, especially in the context of the NFL. As of now, this is just a press release. However, because the statement was made publicly, employers can expect this particular Senator to follow through on his promise. It remains unclear exactly what the Senator has in mind, or what restrictions an eventual law would impose, but the Senator did share that his proposed legislation is intended to deter retaliation against employees who exercise their right to free speech.

#### Conclusion

The workplace will inevitably be a venue for discussion of important social and political issues. As the tensions surrounding these issues ebb and flow, employers would do well to keep themselves apprised of the legal restrictions placed on them with regard to what speech can and cannot be snuffed out. Employers should also keep an ear to the ground to stay alert of any developments in the California Legislature's attempts to expand free speech protections to the private workplace.




